Liechtenstein: good things come in small packages

The Principality of Liechtenstein has a total surface area of 160 km², over half of which is covered by mountains. Its capital, Vaduz, is home to the official residence of the Princely Family as well as the government and parliament buildings. The 38'000 inhabitants of Liechtenstein appreciate the many attractions and activities this small principality has to offer as well as its stability: Liechtenstein has had the same borders and the same good relations with its neighbouring countries for 300 years.

The clue is in the name

The Principality of Liechtenstein is one of two countries in the world to take its name from its head of state. However, the incumbent Prince Hans-Adam II is the first to have grown up in the principality. It was not until 1938 that the Princely Family – one of the world's oldest noble families – moved its official residence to Vaduz Castle. This fortress 120 metres above the town is the main symbol of Liechtenstein. Being close to the people – both geographically and metaphorically – is of great importance to the Princely Family.

A state structure like no other

The Principality of Liechtenstein has a unique state structure. According to the constitution, it is a "constitutional hereditary monarchy on a democratic and parliamentary basis". Power lies both with the "Prince and the People". Therefore, Liechtenstein unites two contrasting forms of government: monarchy and democracy.

Wide world of outdoor adventure




Traditional and modern
